The project MAKE U IN – Maker Education supporting inclusive environments at primary school is a Small Scale Cooperation Partnership in the school sector (KA210–SCH) funded under the Erasmus+ Programme.

The MAKE U IN project aims at strengthening the role of primary school teachers in designing inclusive educational environments, exploiting the potential of Maker initiatives.

The main concrete objectives are:

- To increase primary school teachers' awareness of the inclusive potential of Maker-based activities for disadvantaged students
- To enhance teachers' knowledge, skills, and competencies in integrating maker-based activities to improve student participation, engagement and inclusion.

### MAKE U IN - Resource Repository

The Resource Repository is an online space, accessible via the project website, that offers a comprehensive guide to support inclusive making in educational settings. It provides primary school teachers and educators with theoretical insights, practical tools, and real-life examples to help them implement accessible, student-centered maker activities.

The content was developed based on qualitative research carried out by the MAKE U IN project partners. A total of 35 participants – including primary school teachers and experts in maker education – took part in local focus groups held in Germany, Spain, and Poland.
